





#### **Learning Adventure**


This Learning Adventure consists of an overall story that is split into a series of tasks, missions and challenges. As pupils work through the learning adventure they are awarded a 'Skill Stone' or a 'Knowledge Nugget'. There are 32 'Knowledge Nuggets' or 'Skill Stones' to collect.

Once all stones have been collected the children will present their learning adventure journey. If the class can clearly explain all knowledge and skills gained they will be awarded the centre stone.

This Learning Adventure consists of an overall challenge that is split into a series of tasks, missions and challenges. As pupils work through the learning adventure they are awarded a 'Skill Stone' or a 'Knowledge Nugget'. There are 32 'Knowledge Nuggets' or 'Skill Stones' to collect.

A Learning Adventure covers 6 genres of Writing, Science, History, Geography, Art and Design, Design Technology. Elements of Computing, Music, PE, MFL, RE and PSHE are covered in some Learning Adventures otherwise these are taught as separate subjects. English Grammar, Reading and Maths are taught as a standalone subject









# GOCDNIGHT MISTER TOM MISSION




You are an A.R.P Warden employed by the Prime Minister to protect civilians from danger during the Battle of Britain.

Following instructions from Neville Chamberlain himself, you must protect William Beech, as well as the people of Britain, and make sure they survive the dangers of WW2.













### **Challenge 1: English**

> Your first challenge is to write a persuasive letter to Adolf Hitler in attempt to avoid the war.










# **Challenge 2:** Science - Animals including humans.

Do you know the impact of diet, exercise, drugs and lifestyle on health?




Do you know which type of investigation is needed to suit particular scientific enquiry e.g. looking at the relationship between pulse and exercise?




#### Challenge 3: Design & Technology

Neville Chamberlain has given all of the A. R.P Wardens the responsibility of protecting their people in the event of bombing.

You need to design an Anderson Shelter that will help protect the people of Britain using the following success criteria:

- 1. Two Lego figures must be able to fit comfortably inside.
- 2. Your shelter must be able to withstand a 1kg weight being placed in the roof.
- 3. The two Lego figures must remain dry when 500ml of water is poured over the top of your shelter.
- 4. The shelter and figures must be able to withstand a 30 second blast from an electric fan.





**Developing, planning and communicating ideas:** 

Can they use a range of information to inform their designs? Can they justify their plan to someone else? Can they justify why they have selected specific materials?



#### **Evaluating:**

How well do they test and evaluate their final product? Is it fit for purpose?

What would improve it?

Would different resources have improved their product?

Would they need more information to make it even better?

Does their product meet all design criteria?

Did they consider the use of the product when selecting materials?










### **Challenge 6: English**

To write a fictional biography using the correct features.






# **Challenge 7: Geography**

Your job is to make sure this doesn't happen and to educate the people of Britain to cook nutritious meals with limited ingredients.




Can you explain how food ingredients should be stored and give reasons?




To write an autobiography using the correct features.

Famous Artist - Lowry (Blitz paintings)





# **Challenge 14: History/English**

To write a diary entry from Anne Frank's Point of view.










### **Challenge 15: History/English**
