Monday 20th April	<p><u>Baking</u></p> <p>Make play dough together by measuring and combining ingredients</p> <p>2 cups of plain flour 1 cup of salt 2 cups of water 2 tbsp of vegetable oil 4 tsp of cream of tartare Food colouring (optional)</p> <p>What can you make with your play dough?! Can you make a face? A gingerbread man? A very hungry caterpillar?</p>	<p><u>Nursery Rhymes</u></p> <p>Sing some traditional nursery rhymes together and find your favourites on YouTube.</p> <p>Can you hear any rhyming words in the nursery rhymes?</p>
Tuesday 21st April	<p><u>Counting</u></p> <p>Roll a dice and make play dough balls to match the number that you roll! You can challenge members of your family to see who can do it the quickest!</p>	<p><u>Cutting Class</u></p> <p>Grab some strips of paper or card and draw straight lines, waves or zig-zags for your child to follow, making snips with scissors.</p>
Wednesday 22nd April	<p><u>Patterns</u></p> <p>Use items from around your home to create your own repeated patterns!</p> <p>Try making patterns with your body (e.g. clap, stomp, clap), food in your cupboard, socks in your drawer or using your toys.</p>	<p><u>Name Writing</u></p> <p>Use items from around your home to make the first letter of your name!</p> <p>Try a nature hunt in your garden to try to make the letters of your own name using leaves, twigs, petals etc. You could use the things you</p>

Thursday 23rd April	<p><u>St George's Day</u></p> <p>Use the internet to share the story of George and the Dragon.</p> <p>You can pause the story to encourage your child to -</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● predict what might happen next</li> <li>● recall what has happened so far</li> <li>● think about how the characters are feeling at different points</li> <li>● act out new or interesting words that you come across</li> </ul>	<p><u>St George's Day</u></p> <p>Create your own coat of arms to create a flag or a shield to protect you from a dragon! You could add the St George's cross or create your own design.</p>
Friday 24th April	<p><u>George and the Dragon</u></p> <p>Retell the story of George and the Dragon! You could use your dressing up clothes and use role play to re-enact the story, or use your toys/ figures to recreate it.</p> <p>Can you make a story map to help you retell the story?</p>	<p><u>George and the Dragon</u></p> <p>Make your own dragon! Choose from -</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● A handprint dragon</li> <li>● A paper chain dragon</li> <li>● A paper roll fire breathing dragon</li> </ul>
