Summer Term – Week 3 Learning

Thank you for all the hard work and dedication to home learning so far. It's amazing to see so many of you completing activities and using Purple Mash and Oxford Reading Tree. Each week there will be a new plan of learning for the summer term. This will be a mixture of Phonics, English, Maths and Foundation subject activities. All of the Maths topics over the next few weeks are topics that they children *have not yet* learnt in class. This will be brand new learning to them.

This week's Maths topic – Money – Days of the Week

Monday 4 th May 2020	<p>Phonics – Read Write Inc online – only need to concentrate on Set 2 @10am going forwards. (If you still want to practise set 1, feel free to keep watching it!)</p> <p>A different sound each day. Write some words and a simple sentence containing the days sound https://www.youtube.com/channel/UCo7fbLgY2oA_cFCIq9GdxtQ</p> <p>Maths</p> <p>Ask children 'what are days?' 'what is a week?'. Ask children 'what is the weekend?' – when we stay at home. If you have the book The Very Hungry Caterpillar, read it together, or watch the animated clip of the book on YouTube - https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=75NQK-Sm1YY&t=3s . Recap what the caterpillar ate on each day. Ask questions about which day comes next. Using the Hungry Caterpillar sheet at the bottom of this document – see if you can talk about/cut and stick the food in the right order! Encourage children to talk about the days of the week while they are doing this.</p> <p>Understanding the World – We are continuing learning about animals and their babies! Can you remember some of the animals you have learnt about and what their babies are called? Open the PowerPoint on the website about baby animals. Put the PowerPoint on slideshow mode and see if you can guess the animals!</p> <p>Every day – Read half a book on Oxford Reading Buddy.</p>
Tuesday 5 th May 2020	<p>Phonics – Read Write Inc online – only need to concentrate on Set 2 @10am going forwards. (If you still want to practise set 1, feel free to keep watching it!)</p> <p>A different sound each day. Write some words and a simple sentence containing the days sound https://www.youtube.com/channel/UCo7fbLgY2oA_cFCIq9GdxtQ</p>

	<p>Maths</p> <p>Listen to this days of the week song a couple of times on YouTube and sing along! https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=HtQcnZ2JWsY</p> <p>Slowly repeat the days of the week in order with your child. Ask them questions surrounding the days of the week – “What day comes after...?” Discuss what days we go to school and what days we stay at home.</p> <p>You can use the document below to make your own timetable at home of things you do on each day. E.g you might go to swimming lessons on a Monday, to Grandma’s house on a Tuesday, reading day on a Wednesday, we have star of the week assembly on a Friday, etc. Draw or write the activities you do on each day.</p> <p>RE – See the website for RE tasks. Complete the first section called ‘Explore’. You will be learning what good news is. This knowledge will be used next week when you learn about Pentecost.</p> <p>Every day – Read half a book on Oxford Reading Buddy.</p>
<p>Wednesday 6th May 2020</p>	<p>Phonics – Read Write Inc online – only need to concentrate on Set 2 @10am going forwards. (If you still want to practise set 1, feel free to keep watching it!)</p> <p>A different sound each day. Write some words and a simple sentence containing the days sound https://www.youtube.com/channel/UCo7fbLgY2oA_cFClg9GdxtQ</p> <p>Maths</p> <p>Listen to the days of the week song on YouTube again. Can you sing it by yourself after you have practised?</p> <p>Introduce important language – tomorrow, yesterday, day before, day after, week, next week, weekend – what do they all mean?</p> <p>How many days are in a week – count together.</p> <p>Recap your weekly routine – what do you do on a Monday? Tuesday? Wednesday? Etc.</p> <p>Follow this link to Oak National Academy - https://www.thenational.academy/online-classroom/reception#schedule – Select ‘Reception’ and engage in Tuesday’s lesson which explores the days of the week.</p> <p>As an activity, use the sheet at the bottom of this document. See if you can put the days in the right order!</p> <p>Understanding the World – We are continuing learning about animals and their babies! (If you still want to practise set 1, feel free to keep watching it!)</p> <p>A different sound each day. Write some words and a simple sentence containing the days sound https://www.youtube.com/channel/UCo7fbLgY2oA_cFCIq9GdxtQ</p> <p>Maths</p> <p>See if you can sing the days of the week song by yourself!</p> <p>Ask children questions related to days of the week - What day is it tomorrow? What day was it yesterday? How many days are in a week? What is the weekend? What days do we go to school on? Log on to Purple Mash and paint your own Union Jack flag.</p> <p>Every day – Read half a book on Oxford Reading Buddy.</p>

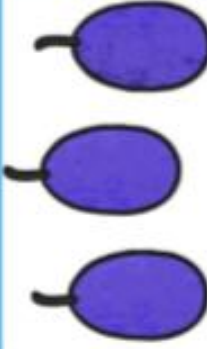


Match the story cards to the correct day of the week.

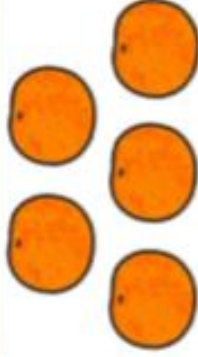

He ate three plums but he was still hungry.



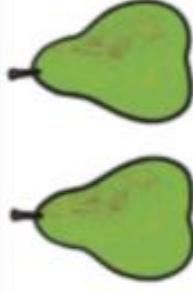
He ate five oranges but he was still hungry.

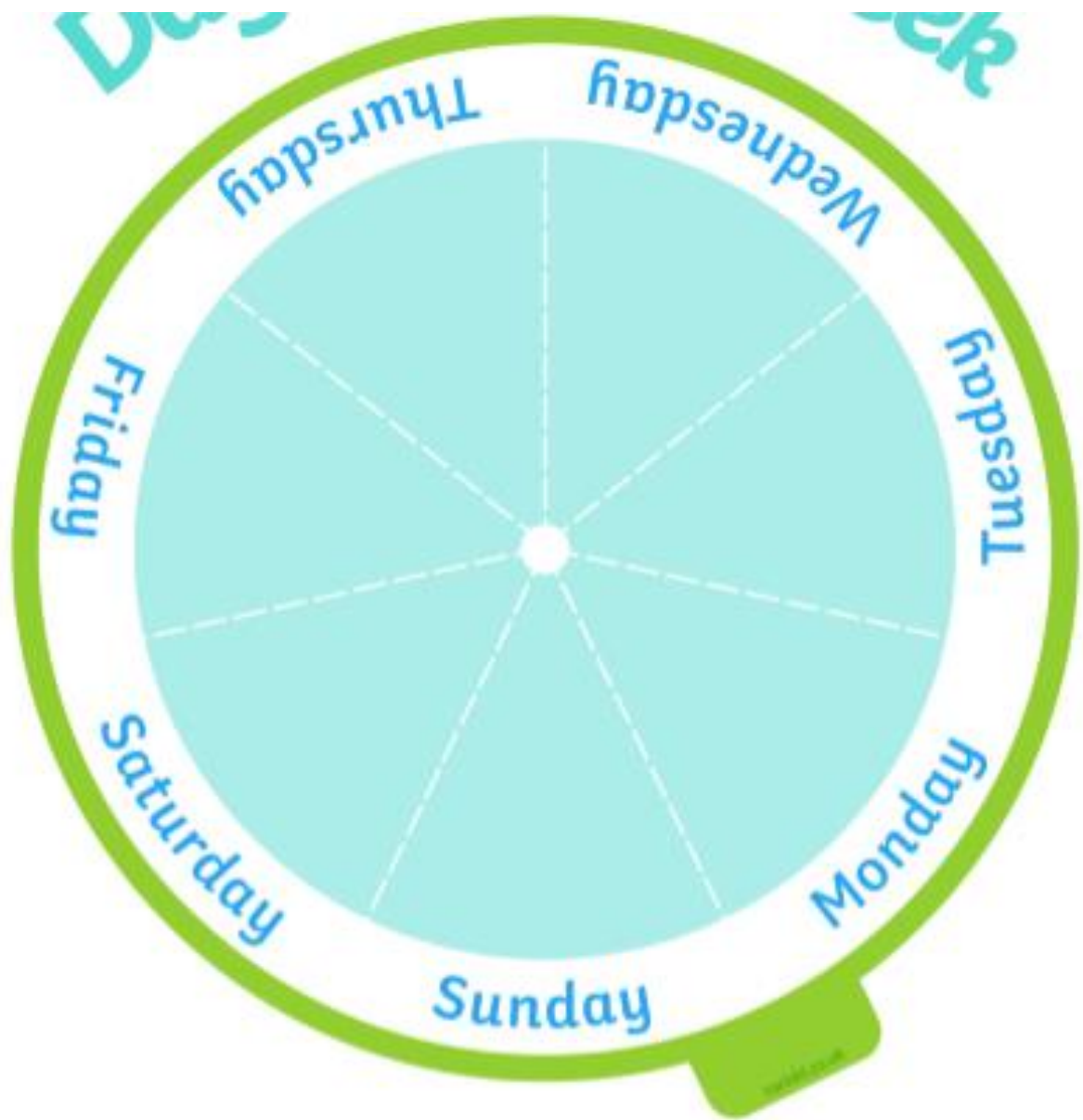

Instructions

- 1 Make sure you print both pages.
- 2 Once printed cut out the top wheel (above).
- 3 Use something sharp to pierce a hole in the centre of the top wheel and through the red dot on the background. Get an adult to help with this and use sticky tack to protect fingers and surfaces whilst piercing the hole.
- 4 Use a split pin to fasten the top wheel to the background.
